## Answer Key

1. Rings is a **very** good movie, but it's a little **too** scary for me.
2. Indian food is **very** tasty, but this dish is **too** spicy! I cannot eat it.
3. I wanted to go for a run in the park, but it's **too** cold today.
4. It gets **very** cold here in the winter. Sometimes it's **too** cold to be outside longer than 10 minutes.
5. This box is **very** heavy, but John is a **very** strong man, so he can carry it.
6. Oh, wow! Look at those shoes. They're **very** expensive.
7. A thousand dollars for that suit is not **very** much, but it's **too** expensive for me. I don't have that much money!  
(Also possible: ... is not **too** expensive...)
8. I can't believe you bought me a new computer for my birthday. Thank you! You're **too** kind.  
(This is a special use of "too." You can also say, "... You're **very** kind.")
9. John was driving **too** fast for that road and had a **very** serious accident.
10. Karen speaks **very** softly! It's **very** difficult to hear what she's saying.  
(Informal English: "Karen speaks **so** softly!")
