

# Subordinating Conjunctions <sup>1</sup>

## **Practice 3**

**Instructions.** Based on <u>the lessons on subordinating conjunctions</u>, choose the correct subordinating conjunction in parentheses to combine each pair of sentences.

**Example: (where / before / because)** I want to go to the beach today. The weather is very nice. **Sentence:** <u>I want to go to the beach today because the weather is very nice</u>.

When you are done, see "Answer Key" to check your answers.

- 1. (when / if / though) I'll buy this app. It's not very expensive.
- 2. (because / although / while) The students cannot understand this story. The vocabulary is too difficult for them.
- 3. (as / while / although) Reading is an important skill. Students must read a lot.
- 4. (whereas / in case / even though) The children are eating everything. They don't like vegetables.
- 5. (because / so that / though) I am saving money. I can buy a new car.
- 6. (if / though / even if) Are you going to visit your parents? You have the time.

7. (when / after / as) Let's go home. It's starting to rain.

8. (while / after / wherever) The teacher wants to talk to me. I finish the test.

9. (as much as / when / in case) I enjoy cooking. I enjoy going out to eat.

10. (Whenever / If / Even though) I need to study. I'm going to John's party tonight.



### **Answer Key**

- 1. I'll buy this app if it's not very expensive.
- 2. The students cannot understand this story because the vocabulary is too difficult for them.
- As reading is an important skill, students must read a lot.
  (Note. Make sure to use a comma between the clauses.)
- 4. The children are eating everything even though they don't like vegetables.
- 5. I am saving money so that I can buy a new car.
- 6. Are you going to visit your parents if you have the time?
- 7. Let's go home as it's starting to rain.
- 8. The teacher wants to talk to me after I finish the test.
- 9. I enjoy cooking as much as I enjoy going out to eat.
- 10. Even though I need to study, I'm going to John's party tonight.(Note. Make sure to use a comma between the clauses.)

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
